










Munro-history

- Munro/Munroe/Monro/Monroe
- Most used Munro
- Derived from Mount of the river Roe(Mountroe)
- Clan Munro 1039AD
- Highest peaks of mountains-Munros
- Typical Scottish Highlanders
- Munro-man from Roe-river in Derry Ireland
- Celtic Origin-Scotland/Ireland/Scotland
- Romans/Danes influences history



Munros-important persons

- First written record of a Munro
- Hugo Munro of Foulis-died 1126
- Got a charter of land from William, Earl of Sutherland.
- 1338-George Munro –charter of land
- 1364-Robert Munro-charter for more land near Foulis.
- Robert married, Jane Ross, niece of Robert 11's wife
- 1547-Robert Munro killed Battle of Pinkie
- 1617-Robert Munro-18th Clan Chief
- Munro's fighters-soldiers-Hector Munro-1634-Baronet
- Mostly Presbyterians in religion
- More than 200 years Deans of Medical Faculty, University of Edinburgh
- Rev Alexander Munro-Principal Edinburgh University-1680
- Travelled seas of the world-photo-p 27
- James Monroe- 5th president of United States-(1758-1831)
- William Munroe-fire first shot in American War of Independence(Lexington 1775)



Alexander Munro 4th Professor of University of Edenburg

Alexander Munro

- Came to Cape as member 93rd Sutherland Highlander Regiment of Foot
- Regiment established 1799
- Most solid/characteristic Highland of all Scottish regiments
- Wear Sutherland tartan
- Acts as a clan
- Commanding officer regarded as a chief
- Gazetted in Scottish Army October 1800
- Sailed July 1805 to recapture Cape from Dutch
- Won Battle of Blouberg-Jan 8, 1805
- Moved into Cape Castle as HQ
- Every member could read/write
- Almost every private own bible.



Lieutenant Alexander James Munro. 44th Battalion AIF

Alexander Munro- Munro Bay

- Resigned from Regiment/Army 1/7/1817(Pama)
- Started as shoemaker/soldier-Cape Town
- 1813 to Mossel Bay-started as seal and whale hunter
- Met and married Martha Maria Boshoff 6/12/1815(Pama)
- Martha from well-known Afrikaans Mosel Bay family
- Build Munro-houses/cottages(3)- 1830-historic spot/Diaz)
- Licence for seal/whale hunting 1831
- Leading role in fishing industry
- Respected citizens
- Started first tavern in town
- Had eleven children/extended family



First build 1830, rebuilt 1978.

Alexander Munro-family history (Petina Munro)

- Alexander-married to Martha Maria Boshoff (George 6 December 1815)
- Father of-Alexander, Lenie, Martha, Joseph, Hendrick, Willem, Louis Jacobus,
- Maria, Beatrice, Pieter and Gideon.
- Louis Jacobus Munro married to Petina Johanna le Roux
- Louis Jacobus / Petina le Roux had five children Hugo, Aletta, Maria, Petina, Louis and John
- Petina Johanna Munro(born 28/12/1924), married to Ronald Coetzee
- Ronald / Petina Coetzee had three children(John, Sharon, Hilton)
- Sharon Coetzee married to Abrie de Swardt(22/12/1984)
- Relationship Alexander Munro
